PROFILE – 2010-2011

The City of Oak Hills/Hesperia is located approximately 100 miles northeast of Los Angeles in the High Desert of San Bernardino County. Oak Hills High School is the **third and newest** high school within the Hesperia Unified School District. This is our second year of operation and we currently serve grades 9-12, with this year's senior class being our first graduating class! Hesperia is a suburban residential community of approximately 87,820 residents. Oak Hills High School attained a three year accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges during the Spring of 2010. The 2010-2011 student population consists of **2258** students - **33%** White, **54%** Hispanic, **10%** African American, **3%** other.

Interpretation of Transcript Issued by Oak Hills High School

The school offers approximately 100 different classes; 47% of classes are identified as college prep; 34% are identified as non-college prep, and 19% are identified as special education.

Method of calculating Grade Point Average: GPA is computed on a scale where A equals 4 points, B equals 3 points, C equals 2 points, D equals 1 point, and F equals 0 points. All courses designated with an "H" or "AP" are assigned weighted grade points (i.e., A = 5, B = 4, C = 3.) A passing mark is considered to be a D- and above; a college-recommending mark is considered to be a C- and above.

Rank in Class: Rank is computed on a weighted system.
